

A MESSAGE FROM NANCY TEAGUE, CEO/FOUNDER



In our 8th year, we continue our mission of training rescue dogs to assist their person with disabilities. Your support Lifts Up 2 Lives!

The demand for our dogs is overwhelming. We're receiving 4 applications/week! Our dogs help their person live a happier, more independent life. Even our release dogs are matched with a person with disabilities as an Emotional Support or In-home service dog. All our dogs are helping someone live a better life!

Our Training Center (opened November 2023) is the soul of our organization. Our staff works more closely together from working together there to train our dogs, discuss our dogs' issues, and brainstorm. We hold Meet & Greets at our Center to see if our paper match of a dog with its potential person is approved by our dog. Our service and release dogs pick their person from our matches.

When we adopt a new pup, they start at our center where they'll decompress from their Rescue experience, and will receive their required veterinary care. Our pups in Volunteer raisers' homes spend short stays at our Center for our trainers to closely assess them, address their issues, to better help them progress.

Our popular Weekend Fosters program allows our community to foster a pup from our Center. These volunteers get a great dog experience, and our dogs are further socialized to a new home and new people. We hold classes at our Center to teach our Volunteers the basics of our training approach and procedures.

FEATURING OUR 9 DOGS IN TRAINING

Like our applicants, each of our dogs in training is unique - in size, breed mix, personality, and abilities.

We train our service dogs an average of 2 years, close to 2,000 hours. If we release a dog before it graduates, we place it with a person with disabilities as a Comfort Dog or In-home service .

FEATURING FRANKIE, **OUR DOG IN TRAINING**

Frankie's story is quite a story. He's quite a dog! His early life was very difficult- his litter was abandoned in a cardboard box at 3 weeks of age on the side of a Mississippi road. Homeward Bound, a Mississippi Rescue Organization, nurtured him until at 9 weeks, they transported him up to Westchester SPCA. We saw his great promise, and adopted him.

Frankie at 17 months, is now the TALLEST dog we've trained so far - probably part Great Dane. Our Head Trainer calls this happy guy a rock star. Frankie's been raised by a Village - first with a Volunteer Puppy Raiser. A death in the family cut that short. Back to our Training Center, for 6 months, then placed at another Volunteer Raiser home this summer. Longtime raisers for us, TALL Frankie captivated them his 2 months there. Back in our Training Center, Frankie started his Formal Training - the last part of our Training Program where his obedience and house manners are honed, and his Service Dog skills are learned. He's come a long way!
